

**Prof Rosanna Cerbo**, Neurologist and Psychiatrist, professor of Neurology at the Umberto I Polyclinic, "Sapienza", University of Rome. Scientific consultant for drug addiction for the Ministry of Health and the Education Authority of Rome. He established and directed the Enzo Borzomati Pain Medicine Center, with various sections. Headaches and neuralgia, in collaboration with the DEA, Maxillofacial - Neurosurgery - General surgery - Anaesthesiology. The center became the Reference Center and HUB of the Lazio Region, which was directed by the first and so far only neurologist in Italy.

From 2010 to 2014 he was a member of the Lazio Regional Coordination for the treatment of chronic pain. Member of Difesan, an organization of the Ministry of Defense, he participated in the organization of various scientific and educational activities in the field of pain therapy in major emergencies. He was "principal investigator" in national and international multicenter studies including, in 2006, (first study Italian and European on the use of Indian hemp derivatives in cancer pain. He has published 250 publications: original articles in national and international journals and books, specific chapters in treatises doctors, such as the Treccani Italian Encyclopedia, taking care of the entries Depression and Psychotropic Drugs and drafting for the Roversi Manual in the penultimate edition, the chapter "Pain therapy"

In 2011 he founded the Karol Wojtyła APS International Association (AIKW), of which he is General Secretary, which has the statutory purpose of fighting human suffering, and deals, in particular, with end-of-life bioethics in the Abrahamic vision, of art and protection of cultural and religious diversity, disabilities, pain therapy in major emergencies, transcultural psychiatrist In 2017, with AIKW he coordinated a scientific document on pain therapy in major emergencies, assistance at birth in women with FGM, project on ritual circumcision for Jews, Coptic Christians and Muslims, performed as a freelancer at the Umberto I Polyclinic (first in Italy) and presented in NYC to the Representative of the Holy See to the Nations United. In 2021 he edited the Glossary of the end of life, aimed at the general population, published by Loffredo Editore.
